

Meet your fellow Modelmaster Member Rick Rizza

1. How did you become interested in the RC hobby/sport?

A very young child (like 5 years old) watched a Walt Disney show called "The Boy who Flew with Condors" and I fell in love with the idea of aviation.

2. How long have you been involved with the hobby/sport?

I got my first model, a Wen Mac P 63 Airacobra with an .049, in the Spring of 1960. It didn't last long as I was 7 years old. I got the first flight and ensuing hard landing. My dad then tried, with similar result. Memory fades. I think I had one more short flight and that was it. A few years later I moved into a Cox PT 19 and learned to fly it. After that, we flew many of the Cox line. My favorite was the Stuka with bomb drop. This happened late grammar school and thru high school. I also took flying lessons and got my Private Pilots license, but after high school, my life went scattered and most flying of all kinds went on hiatus for many years.



3. What aspect of the hobby/sport are you most interested?

My favorite aspect of the hobby is scale fixed wing. I like airplanes that look like actual full scale aircraft flown in a fairly realistic manner.

4. What was your 1st plane?

Mentioned above, it was a Wen Mac Airacobra. My first RC was a kit built Great Planes PT 40, which lasted, with repairs beteen flight 2 and 3, exactly 3 fights

5. Do you have a favorite Plane? If so which one and why?

I have so many planes, it is hard to name a favorite. I have 3 nice WW 1 glow models, a Sopwith Camel, A fokker D7 and a Modeltech SE5. Love them all. Electric I love my Cessna 150 and E flite Cherokee. I jusy got the Twin Otter and have the beautiful e flite P 39! So many airplanes, and every one a favorite and a work of art!

6. What is the most challenging part of the hobby/sport for you?

Loading and unloading the van. Motivating myself to get off my duff and get out there. I'm very good at accumulating stuff and then never using it. Getting organized.

7. What are the goals you wish to accomplish in the hobby/sport?

I don't usually set mileposts or goals for myself to accomplish. A goal in the traditional sense for me might be just getting into my hobby room and doing even ONE thing, be it gluing a broken part or putting a tool away. In a more broad sense, my goal in the hobby is to enjoy it and enjoy the people around me who also enjoy it.

8. What other hobbies or areas of interest do you have?

I'm a lifetime outdoorsman-hunting, fishing, boating and the associated activities were main line pursuits for most of my life. Unfortunately, I got old and fat and these days I am not doing much of anything anymore.

9. What advice do you have for new people getting into the hobby/sport?

I think the best advice anyone can give to a newbie is do it with a friend who already has the knowledge.
