# **Homemade Funcub Skis by George Amenta**



Last winter after a morning flying down at the school and seeing everyone's planes on skis, I decided I wanted a pair for myself. I looked online at the ones made by dubro but decided it would be a fun challenge to try and make my own. And between my brother's two

year ago.

With the snow we have had recently I thought it would be a good time to share the skis my brother and I made for my funcub about a

3d printers and his knowledge of Fusion360 (some design software, he now uses Solid edge by Siemens) I figured we could come up

with something.

My first criteria was that I wanted to be able to mount it to the landing gear struts without any additional hardware. Whatever held the tires on I wanted to work with these. The other requirement was I wanted some sort of bungee system as opposed to the spring system used by dubro due to the more scale look.

The original design included a basic ski shape with a hole in the front for the bungee attachment and the mounting block to attach to the landing gear. Small ridges were added on the bottom as well in an attempt to improve tracking. The length (which we pretty much just eyeballed) was too long to fit on my brother's bigger 3D printer print bed. So, he decided to print in two sections and join them together with a few screws. I





quickly realized that although the front bungee did its job in preventing the front of the skis from digging in, I needed something else to prevent the skis from flipping vertically due to the airflow. So, my brother designed a rear attachment point for a second bungee which took advantage of the preexisting screws used to hold the two halves together. A small bit of epoxy was also used to hold the rear part of the mounting point down. We probably could have improved this part of the design but at the time the snow that was already on the ground was melting and I was just eager to try it out. These "bungees" I keep referring to are just a few rubber bands linked together. I played around with how many I should link up on each side to get the right amount of tension so the front end was pulled up slightly higher than the rear of the ski. The rubber bands are just wrapped around the struts where it attaches to the fuse-lage.

The result is a success. It tracks great on the snow and the rubber bands allow the ski to remain slightly pointed up during flight and rotate to be parallel with the snow on landing. Flying on the snow on skis is fun and it's cool watching the skis and rubber bands doing their job as it pivots around the axle almost like a kind of suspension. I attached a few more pictures showing some close ups. If anyone has any questions feel free to email me. In the end my brother was the one that designed and made these, I just had the idea and tested them out. It was a cool collaborative project that serves its purpose and works pretty well.
