# **Opening Day at The Rhinebeck Aerodrome by Roman Servan-Schreiber**

The Rhinebeck Aerodrome took off for the season on June 17th with its weekly air shows. They got off to a flying start, although the first day had too much wind to allow some of their rickety aircraft to fly.

They have a new aircraft called the Damus D1W joining them for this season. It's an ivory radial engine monoplane from 1933 that looks a bit more modern and shiny than their other aircraft. Clay Hammond, the pilot who owns this plane, flew it over from Florida and now it is there for the season and worth checking out. Clay Hammond is the aerodrome's chief pilot and he often flies the Piper J3 Cub during their shows.

The aerodrome also had a recent minor plane injury this summer when their replica Albatros stood up on its nose upon landing and the wing was bent inward. The pilot was not injured, except for some bruises, and the plane is in repair now. You can see it with its bent wing in one of their hangars.

In other highlights to see, there is a Demoiselle replica in their hangar museum. And don't forget that the hangar is a place for temporarily retired aircraft, so there is a good chance that the Demoiselle will fly again someday. That would be something to see!

# **Field Entrance clean up**
